The Hoosier Home Range Hundred is a series of matches fired at your local Indiana club, with scores turned in across the state. The goal of these matches is to get more participation with less travel. You will shoot as an individual at any Indiana range hosting Hoosier Home Range Hundred matches. For individual awards, your high score at any club will count. For the team awards, you must be a member of the club at which you shoot. Classification is the higher of your current NRA or CMP classification at time of firing the match. These matches must be an 80-round Regional Match Course, fired on the SR1, SR21 and MR31 targets.

1. Matches may be scheduled as early as August 8th, and must be completed by September 30th
2. Shooters may enter the match multiple times at different sites.
3. Highest score of multiple matches at the close of the series (September 30) will be used for calculating awards.
4. Residency and Club membership requirements as noted below.

State Champion

- Must be Indiana resident
- No Club requirements

\$ 75 Second Place Overall High Score

Classification Awards

- Must be Indiana resident
- State Level, 80-round Match Aggregate
- No Club requirements

AWARDS:

For each of the following classifications, \$50 to first place and \$25 to second place.
High Master, Master/MU, Expert, Sharpshooter, & Marksman

Team Match Awards

Each Club will form up a "6-Person Team", consisting of the club shooter with the 80-round Match high aggregate from each classification listed below, and fired at that club. To enter, a team must have a team member in each classification. Team members must be a member of the local club where they are shooting that match.

Required Team Member Classifications: High Master, Master/MU, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman & Junior.

If you are a small club with no one in a given classification, move the high shooter in the next lower class up a class and move the second shooter in the lower class up to first in the class. Continue until you get a 6-person team. Shooters may compete as Juniors in these matches if they are 19 years old, or their 20th birthday is in 2020.

\$60 Second Place Overall Aggregate Team Score

Junior Awards

Winners must be Indiana residents. If Juniors are not local club members, parents/guardians/or custodial adult must be a local club member.

AWARDS:

Junior Male \$ 75 First \$25 Second
Junior Female \$ 75 First \$25 Second

Club Award

For the Club award, qualifying shooters must be local Club members

AWARDS:

Most Shooters \$50

FAQs

- Q If I shoot at Club 1, Club 2, and Club 3, but I'm only a member of Club 1, will all my scores count?
- A Yes, towards the Championship (if you're an Indiana resident) and towards class awards. However, you can only participate in the team match with other members of Club 1, for matches shot at Club 1.
